## Another ARFhouse Project

As most of you know, we've just completed new fencing down the entrance to ARFhouse. We have approximately 30 "yards" in other areas that require shade canopies, either because there are no trees in them, or the trees do not provide shade all day. Therefore, for years we've relied on 8' x 10' commercial shade tarps, attached to frames with

bungies. They've worked fairly well except during very strong winds. Of course, they must be replaced yearly.

Our fence contractor, Curt Sauer, suggested that we (he) build permanent shades in those areas, using steel posts set in concrete and metal that would withstand the weather. They will be larger than our current shades.

Thanks go out to Texas Manufacturing in Whitesboro, TX for donating the pipe which will support these structures.

Materials are expensive and we didn't have the funds for this project, so we asked JOYCE DENNEHY if she would be willing to provide funding. She sent off a check for \$10,000 immediately. We're thrilled and thankful to have this great friend who always gives to the animals.

### Appeal From Martha Hovers

For many years, ARFhouse relied on a small number of supporters for a large portion of operational funds which would arrive in June and take us into December. Everyone who visited ARFhouse seemed to love "Jethro." He was abandoned on Spalding Road 17 years ago as a puppy. He grew to weigh 130 pounds, quite a hefty dog to live so long. He was always up to some shenanigans.

When we would bring in a load of canned dog food, he'd always find a way to get into a box and open all the cans with his teeth. He once knocked over a whole wall of shelves (with product on them) just to chase a rat. When we'd raise our voice at him, he would squint, like that might make us shut up.

On Sunday, June 20, he decided to wade in the pond. But he had some trouble getting out of the water, and when he came on shore, he laid down quickly as though he had no energy. The following day, "Jethro" could no longer get up and walk. His back legs just could not raise that big old body. Dr. Morris gently euthanized him.

For many years, Rick Rehder (Ronda's husband) has sponsored "Jethro." He was always Rick's favorite. He'll be buried in our cemetery with his brick engraved: **"Mighty Jethro, an ARFhouse legend"**
